1. Our Relationship with Believers (Romans 12:10-13)
  - a) Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love
  - b) In honour preferring one another
  - c) Not slothful in business
  - d) Fervent in spirit
  - e) Serving the Lord
  - f) Rejoicing in hope
  - g) Patient in tribulation
  - h) Continuing instant in prayer
  - i) Distributing to the necessity of saints
  - j) Given to hospitality
2. Our Relationship with Unbelievers
  - a) Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not (Rom 12:14,17,21)
  - b) Jesus' golden rule: Do for others what you want others to do for you (Matt 7:12)
  - c) Live peaceably with all men (Rom 12:18)
