1. Too busy for God
 - (a) “The only constant is constant busyness” - are you a busy person?
 - (b) Christians seek all kinds of books, videos, exercise, spiritual improvement programmes to achieve a well-balanced life.
 - (c) Read Luke 10:38-42 to learn the real answer lies in a proper, foundational relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ – key to a life without compromise.
2. Separation from the World (Heb 13:12-13)
 - (a) Believers follow Christ’s example and separate themselves from a sinful world.
 - (b) Believers have nothing in common with the world (2 Cor 6:14). Biblical separation involves having a different attitude and orientation from the world, and not compromising our standards and values to fit the world.
 - (c) Bear in mind Jesus’ prayer for us in John 17:15-18 of a right attitude and proper relationship to the world.
 - (d) Living a separated life is not easy (2 Tim 3:12).
3. Sacrificial Living (Heb 13:15-16)
 - (a) Offering sacrifices of praise should not occur only when we receive blessing but it should characterize us at all times and in all circumstances (1 Thess 5:18).
 - (b) Sacrificial living is practical service and good deeds to others (1 John 3:18).
4. Submissive Attitude (Heb 13:17)
 - (a) Submit to spiritual leaders and authorities. Submit to one another (Eph 5:21; 1 Pet 5:5).
5. Supplication for Others (Heb 13:18)
 - (a) Every believer needs the prayers of fellow believers (Eph 6:19). Pray for a good conscience and to live honestly.
