Topic: Soli Deo Gloria

Scripture Text: Romans 16: 25-27

1. The 16th century Protestant Reformation has this wonderful theme of Soli Deo Gloria which is in Latin and it means Glory to God alone. The Church was in the dark ages before the Reformation and it did not allow the people to read the Bible. They glory in their religious activities, huge church buildings and human traditions. God's glory was lost and the Church is no longer a true Church of Jesus Christ.

- 2. In Romans 16:25-27, it is a Doxology to praise God and to give all glory to Him. God is the Giver of all things. Glory and praise belongs to God for it is His power to save us. Our salvation comes from God alone through Jesus Christ.
