Topic: The LORD is good

Scripture text: Psalm 34:8-10

1. Psalm 34 was written by David after he was delivered from King Saul. He wrote this psalm as a thanksgiving to the LORD. We cannot be forgetful but should remember how the LORD has been

good toward us.

2. David has tasted of the LORD's goodness and wanted others to do the same. We must first have the personal experience of the LORD's goodness before we can tell others about it. It must come from a personal appreciation of what the LORD has done. He has prepared a good meal for us, and

we must have faith to trust Him and taste it.

3. God's saints are given this privilege of tasting His goodness. We are to fear the LORD, which is to give Him reverential respect and awe. We must not be complacent or become covetous when He

has blessed us.

4. Young lions are strong and resourceful but even they will be hungry. However, we will not lack any good thing when we seek the LORD. We may not have certain things now because they are not good for us. The LORD will not withhold good things from us. He has given us His best - the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Therefore, we must trust, fear and seek the LORD, and we will taste and see that He is good.
